These include **LIQUIDS** **AEROSOLS** **GELS** and some **FOODS** if the container is larger than 100ml.

100 grams = 100ml. You can take your creams, jams, waxes, etc., in a container 100 grams or less.

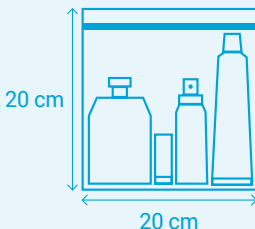


Before checking-in

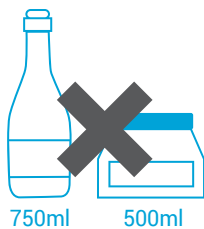
Pack in your main check-in luggage any:

- liquids, aerosols or gels if container larger than 100mls.
- toiletries and foods that can be smeared, sprayed or poured such as honey, butter, jam, chutney etc. if container larger than 100mls.

Ensure that any liquids, aerosols or gels you need for the flight are no larger than 100mls each and that they all fit neatly into a one litre, transparent, resealable plastic bag.



Containers larger than 100 ml (3.4oz) are not accepted

At Security Screening

Present your sealed plastic bag of in-flight liquids, aerosols and gels separately from your carry-on luggage.



Any non-complying items must be relinquished before you can pass through Security Screening.
